

## Template Email to President and Governmental Relations Office

Funding for education is dependent on having a healthy economy. If the increase in severe weather events and additional weather extremes of droughts and floods continue to require emergency funds, this will disrupt national and regional economies. Every educational leader has a unique and important role to play to help create a more economically and environmentally sound future.

Initially piloted by the Policy and Legislative Workgroup of the Green Universities and Colleges Subcommittee of the Green Government Coordinating Council of Illinois, the SEED Action Community has continued to research a number of issues that can result in more jobs for our students and a more robust regional economy, thereby making us more successful as colleges and universities.

The issue we are sharing with you now involves the need for President Obama to use the existing authority Congress has already bestowed upon him to address climate change. Climate change, which is no longer a threat but a reality, requires action to be taken for our health and economic well being.

We are sharing this information with you so you can send a letter, either as a college president or as an educated citizen, to encourage key actions to address climate change, such as policies that can be adopted to reduce emissions of heat-trapping pollution, make our nation more resilient to the effects of climate change, and to prevent and respond to the effects of climate change.
